Disclaimer


This kit from LANKOTA adds 1700 lbs. to the front of a tractor. Never exceed manufacturer's specified load limit on the front of a tractor! This may mean that weights or a weight bracket may need to be removed from the tractor to install this kit.


WARNING: After completing installation, be careful around the wings the first dozen or so times they are folded/unfolded. The process of purging the air from the hoses can cause the wings to jerk up and down dangerously and unexpectedly.

1. If applicable, remove the OEM toolbox bracket on the front driver side frame. Attach the toolbox mounting bracket (LANSST-JDTB) to the left roller mount (LANSR054) with 1/2" x 1 1/2" carriage bolts (LAN506K) and 1/2" serrated flange nuts (LAN3722). The toolbox can be re-attached later.

Tractors without front weights or weight bracket: Skip to Step 4.


2. Remove the four outside frame bolts (in front of the front tire) and leave the center two bolts in place. (Shown in Figure 2). The mount will fit over the center bolts to be left tight to support the front weights.



- 3. Remove the three bolts in the weight bracket (Shown in Figure 3).
- 4. Attach mounting bracket LANSR054 (drivers side) and LANSR055 (passenger side) through the four open holes directly in front of the front tire (Shown in Figure 4). If present, temporarily start a bolt through the front of the mount into the weight bracket. (See next page for bolt sizes.)











For Tractors with Front Weights: Attach the brackets each with two M20 x 100 bolts, washers and nuts (shown with white circles in Figure 6) and two M20 x 60 bolts, washers and nuts. Attach the front of the bracket through the tractor weight bracket using the previously removed hardware.

For Tractors without Front Weights: Attach brackets each with four M20 x 60 bolts, washers and nuts.

 Bolt the cross support LANSR056 between the mounts LANSR054 and LANSR055 using four 3/4" x 2" hex bolts, washers, and serrated flange nuts.
 For Tractors with Front Weights: Bolt directly to the weight bracket (Figure 7)

- 6. Plastic washers (LANSR009) are provided to eliminate metal to metal contact between the wing frames (LANSR038 & LANSR039) and the mount frame (LANSR054 & LANSR055). Make sure these are in place in the following steps.
- 7. Using the pivot pin (LANSR008) attach the wing frames to the mount frame. Retain the pivot pin with the provided 1/2" bolt (LANFC507) and lock nut (RED1F30). When in the driver's seat, LANSR038 will be on your left, and LANSR039 will be on your right.
- 8. Install the hydraulic cylinders (LANW250100-S) with included pins. Make sure the ports are facing toward the tractor and that the rod end is connected to the wing frames (LANSR038 & LANSR039).



- 9. When the cylinder is completely extended, the wing frame should be parallel to the ground. There is room for minor adjustments by screwing the clevis in/out of the rod. (If the tractor is parked on a level surface, this can be verified by placing a level on the wing frame as shown in Figure 11.)
- 10. Using the provided 5/8" U-bolts (LAN079UBOLT) and serrated flange nuts (LAN690830), attach the three row mounts to the stalk roller wing frames (LANSR038 & LANSR039).
- 11. Slide the roller left or right along the wing to cover the path of the tires. Tighten all U-bolts.

NOTE: The roller drum will be angled toward the back of the tractor.





NOTE: Use the hydraulic schematic on the previous page as a reference for the following hydraulic installation procedures.

Refer to Figure 14 & 15

12. Attach a 90 degree fitting on the base end of the cylinder and a straight fitting on the rod end of the cylinder. A 52" hose will be attached to the straight fitting. A 64" hose will be attached to the 90 degree fitting. Do this on each cylinder.

Note: Two 90 degree fittings can be used on each cylinder to make the hose routing cleaner.

13. Both sets of hoses will meet up and attach to the tee fittings in the middle. Make sure cylinder base hoses are together and rod end hoses are together. Also make sure that the hoses have enough freedom to move as the wing frames rotate up 90 degrees.

- 14. Attach the two 312" hoses to the tee fittings and tape the open ends to keep them clean and free of debris. Secure hoses with zip ties.
- 15. When facing the front axle from the front of the tractor, route the two hose over the left hand side of the front axle towards the back of the tractor.









16. Move behind the front axle.


17. Route the hoses as shown to the rear of the tractor. (Follow the blue arrows)







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Secure the hoses with zip ties wherever necessary.

18. Connect the tee, adapter and pioneer hydraulic fittings together.

Attach to the rear end of the 310" hoses and tighten. NOTE: The tee allows this set of hydraulic remotes to be run simultaneously with another hydraulic circuit if required.

19. Plug into a set of hydraulic remotes.



- 20. Two pins (LANSS704) are included to hold the wing frames UP during long term storage. The purpose is to keep the hydraulic cylinders from settling. An extra hole is provided for storage of the pin while the rollers are in use.
- 21. Operate the hydraulics up and down to purge the air from the lines and cylinders.
- 22. If applicable, re-attach the OEM toolbox to the toolbox mounting bracket (LANSST-JDTB), using the existing hardware.








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

- 23. If tractor is equipped with a tow cable, the following options are available to support the cable end.
- A. If equipped with weights, the original storage pin can be swapped to the inside of the weight bracket as shown in Figure 28.
- B. If no front weights are present, connect the cable storage hook (LAN8RTC007) and stow latch (LANJDTC105) with a $5/8" \times 1-3/4"$ bolt (REDB707), bronze bushing (LANF-BZBS-0.69-0.50), 5/8" washer (LAN26000), and 5/8" top lock nut (REDKRJF). Attach the assembly to the cross member (LANSR056) with $5/8" \times 1-3/4"$ bolts (REDB707), 5/8" washers (LAN26000), and 5/8" serrated flange nuts.









Headlight Clearance Consideration

Refer to Figures A, B & C

If additional light clearance is required, install cylinder stops (LANSCA-1) as necessary (one or two) on each cylinder to hold the roller arms away from the lights.

Note: The cylinder stops will need to be removed in order to utilize the storage pin position (See






